



Polo is behind the square bale of hay. Hay bales can come in several different sizes. Round bales are the largest, weighing in between 1,000 and 1,200 pounds. One round bale has the equivalent amount of hay to 20-30 small square bales. Hay is a great way to provide forage (cellulose) in a horse's diet if there isn't enough grass present for them to graze. One horse weighing 1,000lbs will eat 15-20lbs of forage a day. Square hay bales are fed by flake, and the weight of a flake of hay varies depending on what type of forage the square bale is made of. Not all square bales are hay, some are alfalfa (a legume).
